

STATEMENT BY ALEX SANDERS

The governing board of the Charleston School of Law has asked me to accept the title of Chair Emeritus. I am happy to accept. Although I have retired from the Board and no longer have any ownership interest in the school, the Charleston School of Law has my continued and enthusiastic support. I will support the school in any way that I can, including by continuing to participate in the Professionalism Series, as well as seminar programs.

I have inquired into the recent arrangement between the Charleston School of Law and InfiLaw, and I am assured of the following:

- \$ The culture, mission and core values of CSOL will remain consistent with its history.
- \$ InfiLaw was carefully selected because of its commitment to maintain the culture, mission and core values of CSOL.
- \$ CSOL will continue to be student focused and place a major emphasis on high quality teaching and faculty accessibility.
- \$ CSOL will continue to teach the practice of law as a profession, having as its chief aim providing public service, and will maintain the *pro bono* graduation requirement.
- \$ CSOL will continue its commitment to the City of Charleston and its Bench and Bar.

As a result, I am convinced there is every reason to believe that the arrangement between the Charleston School of Law and InfiLaw will bring about a bright future for the school and will result in an even better school.
