#### QUICKLY...

- ◆ The No. 13/12 South Carolina Gamecocks (3-1, 1-1 SEC) return home this week to face the Kentucky Wildcats (1-3, 0-1 SEC) in an SEC Eastern Division battle. Game time is set for 7:38 p.m. ET on FSN with Bob Rathbun and Tim Couch in the booth and Elizabeth Moreau working the sidelines. This is the first of six-consecutive conference games for the Gamecocks and their final home contest until November 2. The game is a sellout.
- ◆ The Gamecocks are 3-1 on the season, opening with a 27-10 non-conference win over North Carolina, then splitting their first two SEC games, falling at Georgia, 41-30, before bouncing back with a 35-25 win over Vanderbilt. The Gamecocks stepped out of conference last week and came away with a 28-25 win in Orlando over UCF.
- ◆ Carolina is putting its home winning streak on the line this week. The Gamecocks have won 13-straight home games, tying for the second-longest home winning streak in school history, two shy of the school record. It also is the third-longest home winning streak in the country, behind only Michigan (17) and Georgia (15).
- ◆ Kentucky is off to a 1-3 start this season, with a win over Miami (Ohio) sandwiched around a pair of non-conference losses to instate rivals Western Kentucky and Louisville. Last week, Kentucky dropped its SEC opener at home to the Florida Gators, 24-7.
- ◆ Carolina begins a three-game road swing next week when it travels to Fayetteville to face the Arkansas Razorbacks on Saturday, Oct. 12. Arkansas leads the all-time series, 13-8. Trips to Tennessee and Missouri follow.

### A South Carolina win over Kentucky would...

- ◆ Be No. 20 for head coach Steve Spurrier against the Wildcats. He is currently 19-1 all-time against Kentucky, with that lone loss coming in the 2010 season. No current Division I coach has 20 wins against any one school.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks' home winning streak to 14-straight games, which would be the second-longest in school history. Their current 13-game home winning streak is the third-longest current home winning streak in the country, trailing only Michigan (17) and Georgia (15).
- ◆ Be the Gamecocks' 13th win in the last 14 meetings with Kentucky.
- ◆ Keep the Gamecocks in the mix for the SEC Eastern Division title with just one conference loss.

**SETTING THE STAGE:** The No. 12/13 South Carolina Gamecocks (3-1, 1-1 SEC) return home to face the Kentucky Wildcats (1-2, 0-0 SEC) in an SEC Eastern Division matchup on Saturday, October 5. The game is a sellout. Game time is set for 7:38 p.m. ET with Bob Rathbun and Tim Couch in the booth and Elizabeth Moreau working the sidelines for FSN. Todd Ellis and Tommy Suggs handle the call for the Gamecock Radio Network with Langston Moore on the sidelines. WKNT (107.5 The Game) in Columbia is the flagship station for Gamecock Athletics.

**A LITTLE HISTORY:** 2013 marks the 120th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 107th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina is 22 games over the .500 mark with an all-time record of 568-546-44. The Gamecocks were nine games under .500 until head coach Steve Spurrier took the reins in 2005, but are 31 games over since.

**SEC HISTORY:** The 2013 season marks South Carolina's 22nd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their first SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 73-96-1 all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 18-8 since 2010 in conference action.

**CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY:** This is the 25th game in a series that dates back to 1937 between the Gamecocks and Wildcats. Carolina leads the all-time series 16-7-1, including a 7-3-1 mark in Columbia and a 9-4 advantage in Lexington. South Carolina has won each of the last two meetings, a 38-17 decision in Lexington last season and a 54-3 rout in Columbia in 2011. Kentucky's last win was by a 31-28 count in Lexington in 2010, snapping South Carolina's 10-game winning streak in the series. The teams played just three times (1937, 1978 and 1981) before Carolina joined the SEC for the 1992 season. Since then, they have met every year. Since joining the league, the Gamecocks own a 15-6 record against UK, including wins in 12 of the 13 meetings in this century. Kentucky has not won at Williams-Brice Stadium since 1999.

**SPURRIER VS. KENTUCKY:** South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier owns a 19-1 all-time record against Kentucky, including a 7-1 mark as head coach at South Carolina. The 19 wins matches his mark against Vanderbilt (19-2) as his most wins against any school. He also has double-digit wins against Georgia (15-6), Tennessee (14-8), LSU (11-4), Auburn (10-8) and South Carolina (10-1). Coach Spurrier's offenses have scored 30+ points in 15 of 20 games against Kentucky, including 10 games of 40+ points.

**19 GOING ON 20:** Head coach Steve Spurrier is looking for his 20th career victory against Kentucky. He is currently 19-1 all-time against the Wildcats. No current head coach has won more games against one school than what Coach Spurrier has done against Kentucky and Vanderbilt. Here is the short list:

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET:** Sixth-ranked South Carolina erased a 10-point halftime deficit, scoring 31 second-half points, on its way to a 38-17 win over Kentucky on Sept. 29, 2012 in Lexington. **Marcus Lattimore** carried 23 times for 120 yards in the win, while **Connor Shaw** completed 15-of-18 passes for 148 yards and two touchdowns and added 76 yards on the ground on 19 carries. After allowing 17 points and 173 yards in the first half, the Carolina defense pitched a shutout in the second half, limiting Kentucky to just 70 yards over the final 30 minutes.

**THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN COLUMBIA: Connor Shaw** threw for a then-career-high 311 yards and four touchdowns to lead No. 18/14 South Carolina to a convincing 54-3 win over Kentucky in Columbia on Oct. 8, 2011. Shaw completed 26-of-39 passes as Carolina rolled up 639 yards of total offense in the contest, the most in the Steve Spurrier Era at South Carolina. Meanwhile, the Gamecock defense stifled Kentucky all day, limiting the Wildcats to just 96 yards of offense, including 17 through the air, forcing six turnovers.

**THE LAST TIME OUT:** The No. 12/13 Gamecocks traveled to Orlando for a non-conference matchup with UCF on Saturday, September 28, and came away with a hard-fought 28-25 win over the previously undefeated Knights. UCF opened up a 10-0 lead at the intermission, but Carolina came out and physically dominated the Knights in the second half, scoring 28 consecutive points before UCF scored two fourth-quarter TDs to make the game interesting late. **Mike Davis** was the workhorse, churning out a career-high 167 yards rushing on 26 carries with three touchdowns, tying the school record. 150 of the yards came after intermission, including a 53-yard scamper for the Gamecocks' first score early in the third period. South Carolina totaled 490 yards of offense (326 after halftime) to UCF's 427, and each team committed four turnovers. **A.J. Cann** was selected as the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week.

**WIN STREAK EXTENDED:** With the win over UCF, South Carolina extended its winning streak against non-conference opponents to 12 games. South Carolina's last non-conference loss came to Florida State in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl. South Carolina's regular season non-conference winning streak increased to 18 games with the win. The Gamecocks last regular season non-conference loss was at Clemson in the final game of the 2008 regular season.

**HURTIN' FOR CERTAIN:** Carolina will be without the services of starting quarterback **Connor Shaw** and backup tailback **Brandon Wilds** for at least the Kentucky game. Shaw suffered a sprained right shoulder while Wilds sustained a sprained elbow at UCF. Shaw's loss is especially big in that he has had his fair share of success against Kentucky. In two starts against Big Blue, Shaw was 41-for-57 (71.9 percent) for 459 yards with six touchdowns and no interceptions. His four TD passes in the 2011 game remains a career high.

**BE LIKE MIKE:** Sophomore running back **Mike Davis** continues to impress. The Lithonia, Ga. product rushed for a career-high 167 yards in the win at UCF, including 150 after intermission. He scored three rushing touchdowns, tying the school record, held by many. He has three 100-yard rushing games in four outings this season. Davis is the SEC's leading rusher, averaging 127.0 yards per contest, is second in all-purpose yardage at 158.8 yards per game, and is tied for fourth in scoring at 9.0 points per game. Davis ranks 12th in the nation in rushing. Here are the leaders:

**PICKIN' AND GRINNIN':** The Gamecocks intercepted three passes in the win over UCF, with **Victor Hampton**, **Jimmy Legree** and **T.J. Holloman** all register-

ing a pick. The Gamecocks had just one interception in the season's first three contests. For the game, Carolina forced a season-high four turnovers. They had forced just three turnovers in the first three contests combined.

**GO THE DISTANCE:** South Carolina produced a pair of 90-plus yard drives in the win over Vanderbilt. The Gamecocks went 93 yards in 11 plays, using 3:58 in the first quarter, resulting in a **Mike Davis'** 4-yard run, then went 92 yards in eight plays, consuming 3:23 with **Bruce Ellington** scoring on a 26-yard pass from **Connor Shaw** early in the second stanza. It marked the first time the Gamecocks had recorded multiple drives of over 90 yards in a game since a 2011 contest against The Citadel and the first time in SEC play since 2006 versus Arkansas. The Gamecocks then went a season-best 97 yards in a scoring drive at UCF, taking 11 plays and using 5:02 of the clock, with **Dylan Thompson** scoring from two-yards out. That matched the fourth-longest scoring drive in the Spurrier Era at Carolina.

**BEST OFFENSE IN HISTORY?:** Through four games, Carolina has generated 1,929 yards of offense, 482.2 yards/game. That's the school's high water mark for the season's first four games since at least 1962, when full records are available. That averages has them ranked fourth in the SEC and 32nd in the country.

**1,000-1,500-2,000:** The Gamecocks have logged over 1,000 yards of offense in consecutive games twice this season, going for 454 at Georgia before gaining 579 against Vanderbilt, then coupling the Vandy total with the 490 gained at UCF. It is just the eighth and ninth time since joining the SEC in 1992 that Carolina has produced 1,000 or more yards of offense in back-to-back games. They have garnered 1,523 yards over the last three games, averaging over 500 yards of offense in a three-game stretch for just the third time since 1992. It was done previously in 1995 (1,704) and again in 2006 (1,549). They have cleared the 2,000-yard plateau over a four-game stretch just once, that coming in 1995. Here are the particulars:

**GOOD HOME COOKIN':** The Gamecocks have won their last 13 games at Williams-Brice Stadium. Carolina is 29-3 in its last 32 home games. The only home losses since 2009 came to top-ranked Florida in 2009, to 17th-ranked Arkansas in 2010 and to defending national champion Auburn in 2011. The Gamecocks' 13-game home winning streak is the third-longest in the nation, trailing only Michigan (17) and Georgia (15).

**TOP HOME STREAKS:** The Gamecocks have won 13-straight home games, their longest stretch since joining the SEC and tying for the second-longest streak in school history. Only a 15-game home winning streak from 1978-80 has been longer. Here are the top home winning streaks:

**PERFECT AT HOME:** The Gamecocks went 7-0 at home in 2012. It marked the first time they ran the table at home since joining the SEC. The last time they had gone undefeated at home previously was in 1987. They have been undefeated and untied at home 10 times.

**MAKING HISTORY:** The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back 11-win seasons, the first back-to-back, double-digit win seasons in school history. They have logged two of their three 10-or more win seasons in the last two years. The only previous 10-win campaign came in 1984. Entering the 2013 campaign, the Gamecocks have won 22 games over the past two seasons, 31 over the past three seasons, and 38 over the past four seasons, all school records.

**TOP-10 PROGRAM:** The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back Top 10 finishes for the first time in school history, finishing ninth in 2011 and eighth in 2012 according to the Associated Press. They finished one spot higher in the Coaches' poll both years. The Gamecocks have finished among the nation's Top 25 for three-straight seasons, another "first" in school history. Here are South Carolina's final AP Top-25 rankings:

**YEAR (FINAL AP):** 1958 (13); 1984 (11); 1987 (15); 2000 (19); 2001 (13); 2010 (22); 2011 (9); 2012 (8).

**THE 2013 RANKINGS:** The Gamecocks entered the 2013 season with the highest national ranking in school history. They opened the season sixth in the Associated Press poll and seventh in the USA Today/Coaches poll. The previous high to open a season came in 2012 when they opened at No. 9 in both major polls. They were ranked sixth in both polls after week one, but slipped to No. 13/14 following a road loss at Georgia when they were the underdog. They were ranked 12th/13th for consecutive weeks, then flip-flopped those two spots in the most recent poll.

**YES THEY CALL IT A STREAK:** The Gamecocks are tied for the fifth-longest current streak of being ranked in the Associated Press's Top 25. Carolina and Stanford have been ranked for 53-consecutive weeks, trailing only Alabama, LSU, Oregon and Oklahoma. Carolina's streak started with the second week of the 2010 season and is the longest consecutive streak in school history.

**THE AP TOP-10:** The Gamecocks were ranked in the top-10 for a school-record 10-consecutive Associated Press polls, the final two of the 2011 season and the first eight of the 2012 campaign, before falling out after successive losses at LSU and Florida. The Gamecocks have been ranked in the AP Top 10 33 times in school history, 19 under Steve Spurrier, including 16 times since 2011. They started the 2013 season in the top 10, but fell out after losing as a road underdog at Georgia.

**AT THE TOP OF THE LEADERBOARD:** Head coach Steve Spurrier recorded his 65th victory at South Carolina in the 2012 the regular-season finale at Clemson. He surpassed Rex Enright (64) for the most coaching wins in school history. He now owns 69 wins at South Carolina. He is also the winningest coach at Florida with 122 victories. The legendary Bear Bryant (60 at Kentucky and 232 at Alabama) is the only other coach to own the most wins at two SEC schools.

**TOPS IN HIS FIELD:** Steve Spurrier became the 71st head college football coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I history to record 200 wins when he accomplished that feat against UAB in 2012. He ranks third among active Division I coaches with 211 wins. In addition, the HBC has 47 wins as a head coach at the professional level, giving him 258 career coaching wins.

**NEW TERRITORY:** The 2013 Outback Bowl marked the seventh time Coach Spurrier has taken Carolina to a bowl game. They have been bowl-eligible in each of his eight campaigns. No other coach in history has taken the Gamecocks to more than three bowl games. Coach Spurrier is 3-4 in bowl games at Carolina, including back-to-back bowl wins over Nebraska (Capital One Bowl) and Michigan (Outback Bowl). He is the only Gamecock coach to post three bowl victories.

**HAVING A SENIOR MOMENT:** The Gamecocks list five seniors on their roster, including four scholarship seniors. That is the fewest number of seniors in Division I football in 2013. The quintet includes QB **Connor Shaw**, OG **Ronald Patrick**, DE **Chaz Sutton**, CB **Jimmy Legree** and walk-on WR **David Wilkins**. Interestingly, the Gamecocks face four of the top 14 schools that list the fewest seniors (North Carolina, UCF, Mississippi State and Clemson).

**SHAW AS A STARTER:** Senior quarterback **Connor Shaw**, a 6-1, 209-pounder from Flowery Branch, Ga., is 20-4 as a starter, including a 12-0 mark at home. He and Jeff Grantz are the only two players in school history to pass for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards. In the loss at Georgia, he became the ninth player in school history to pass for over 4,000 yards in a career, hence becoming the first 4,000-1,000 player in school history. He is

the school's all-time leader in completion percentage at 66.5 percent and is tied for fourth with 38 touchdown passes.

**THROWING STRIKES:** When the Gamecocks pitch it around the park, there's been no one who has been more accurate in school history than **Connor Shaw**. Shaw is hitting 66.5 percent of his pass attempts and has gone a career-best 118 pass attempts without an interception.

**GETTING HIS CHANCE:** Junior **Dylan Thompson** will get the start with Shaw sidelined with a shoulder injury. Thompson, a 6-3, 218-pounder from Boiling Springs, S.C., has proven to be a worthy replacement. In 2012, Thompson led the Gamecocks to wins over East Carolina and Clemson in his two starts, throwing for over 300 yards on both occasions. He also was 7-of-10 for 117 yards and two touchdowns in the bowl win over Michigan, including the game-winning 32-yard pass to Bruce Ellington with just 11 seconds remaining in the contest. In 2013, Thompson completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to Kane Whitehurst in the

season opener against North Carolina, the only snap he took from scrimmage in that contest. In his first series against Vanderbilt he led the team on a eight-play, 76-yard drive that culminated with his three-yard TD run. He played most of the game at UCF, completing 15-of-32 passes for 261 yards. For the season, he is 23-of-42 (54.8 percent) for 365 yards and one TD with two picks.

**WITH 50 YOU GET 72:** There have been 72 recorded rushes of 50 yards or more from scrimmage in South Carolina history. **Mike Davis** has logged four of those in his first 16 games. He had a 50-yarder as a true freshman against UAB last season. His 75-yard burst against North Carolina in the 2013 season opener and his first career start was the longest by a Gamecock since Bobby Wallace went for 88 against Middle Tennessee in 2006, and tied for the 12th-longest run in school history. He matched that with another 75-yard burst at Georgia, playing for the first time as a collegian in his home state. Of the 14 runs in school history of 75 yards or longer, Davis is the only one to do it twice. His fourth-career 50-yard jaunt came at UCF, a 53-yard TD run. Only Derek Watson has more runs of 50-plus yards at Carolina. Here's the list of those with three or more:

**100-YARD EFFORTS:** The Gamecocks have three 100-yard rushing games this season, all from **Mike Davis**, after notching just four a season ago when they got three from Marcus Lattimore and one from Kenny Miles. Davis become the third player on the roster with a 100-yard rushing game in his career, joining **Brandon Wilds** (3) and **Connor Shaw** (1). Both Wilds and Shaw turned in their 100-yard efforts during the 2011 campaign. Davis logged a 115-yard performance against North Carolina in his first career start. He came back at Georgia, playing in his home state for the first time, and responded with a 149-yard effort on just 16 carries, an average of 9.3 yards per tote, with one touchdown. He had his career-best day with 167 yards and three touchdowns on 26 carries at UCF.

**CATCH THIS:** The Gamecocks have spread the wealth in the passing game this season with 13 different players getting receptions and three different players leading the team in receiving in the four games this season. The top three receivers are all juniors:

◆ **Bruce Ellington** is the top returning receiver. He logged 40 receptions for 600 yards and seven touchdowns last season. After a slow start, he had his best game as a Gamecock against Vanderbilt, catching eight passes for 111 yards, both career highs. For the season, he has a team-high 14 catches for a team-best 229 yards with one touchdown. Ellington went over the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career in the win at UCF.

◆ **Nick Jones** is not the biggest guy on the roster or have the most raw talent. All he does is catch passes. The 5-7, 174-pounder from Moore, S.C. had his best game as a Gamecock, catching six passes for 97 yards and two touchdowns in the loss at Georgia, all career highs. His TD catches came from 18 and 30 yards out. His previous highs were four receptions (4 times) and 78 receiving yards. He had just one career touchdown coming into the season, but has found paydirt three times in 2013. For the season, he has 12 catches for 136 yards and three scores.

◆ **Damiere Byrd**, the fastest player on the squad, had his best game at UCF, catching a career-high five passes for 74 yards. He has eight catches on the season for 108 yards.

He came into the season with eight touchdown receptions among his 22 career catches. Sophomore **Jerrell Adams** averaged over 22 yards a catch on just four receptions last season. With Anderson checking in at 6-5, 242, and Adams at 6-6, 237, both can present a matchup challenge for a defense.

Cann** is the most experienced of the group with 29 career starts, the most on the squad, and is an All-SEC candidate. He is the reigning SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against UCF. Senior right guard **Ronald Patrick** started all 13 games last season and has made 17 straight starts. season. The lone newcomer is redshirt freshman **Cody Waldrop**, who has big shoes to fill in replacing T.J. Johnson, who graduated as the school's all-time leader with 53 starts. Waldrop was hampered by a foot sprain suffered in the win over North Carolina, and was unable to answer the bell for the next two contests before returning last week at UCF. He was replaced admirably by redshirt freshman **Clayton Stadnik**, who saw his first career action at Georgia, then earned distinction for his play against Vanderbilt.

**YOUNG STADNIK:** Redshirt freshman **Clayton Stadnik** was honored as the SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Vanderbilt. The 6-3, 281-pounder from Greensboro, N.C. graded out at 82 percent while playing all 87 snaps in the win over the Commodores. The line did not give up a sack or quarterback hurry in that contest while rolling up 579 yards of offense. Clayton's twin brother, **Brock**, is also a member of the Carolina offensive line.

**AS GOOD AS IT GETS:** The 2013 Gamecocks feature one of the game's top players in junior defensive end **Jadeveon Clowney**. Clowney, who is regarded by most as the top defensive player in the country and a likely top pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, was just the second Gamecock to earn unanimous All-America honors in 2012, joining George Rogers from his Heisman Trophy season in 1980. Clowney was named the Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end, and the All-America Player of the Year, presented by AT&T as selected by the fans on ESPN.com. He finished sixth in the Heisman race and was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy, Rotary Lombardi Award and the Bednarik Award after being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year by the league's coaches.

**THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN:** Fresh off his trip to L.A. to receive the ESPY Award for the top play of the year, **Jadeveon Clowney** is back to cause havoc for quarterbacks around the southeast. As a sophomore, Clowney set school records last season for sacks in a game (4.5 at Clemson), sacks in a season (13.0) and tackles for loss in a season (23.5). The 6-6, 274-pounder was on everyone's preseason All-America list and a legitimate candidate for all the national awards. With 2.0 sacks and 3.0 tackles for loss this season, he continues to move up the all-time Carolina charts in those categories. In addition, he has nine career forced fumbles. **FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE:** **Jadeveon Clowney** is not the only Gamecock who can get to the quarterback. Fifth-year senior **Chaz Sutton**, who has spent the past two years backing up Clowney and Devin Taylor (now with the Detroit Lions), logged 5.0 sacks last season. He leads the team with 4.5 tackles for loss and has 16.0 in his career. Junior **Kelcy Quarles**, another All-SEC candidate, logged 3.5 sacks and 8.0 tackles for loss last season. He has a team-high 3.0 sacks in 2013.

**SACK MASTERS:** After leading the SEC and finishing fifth in the country with 43 sacks a year ago, the Gamecocks are among the leaders again in sacks this season. **NEW FACES:** The Gamecocks graduated five seniors who manned the linebacker and Spur positions a year ago and have a host of youngsters to fill in those slots this season. Sophomores **Kaiwan Lewis** and **Marquis Roberts** have started every game this season at the two linebacker spots, while junior **Sharrod Golightly** has started every game at Spur. Sophomore **Cedrick Cooper**, who dislocated his elbow in the preseason, redshirt freshman **T.J. Holloman** and true freshman **Skai Moore** also see action. Lewis (22 tackles), Roberts (21), Moore (16) and Golightly (15) are among the top-6 Gamecocks' in tackles this season.

**SECONDARY IN NATURE:** South Carolina returned three starters in the secondary in junior cornerback **Victor Hampton**, senior cornerback **Jimmy Legree** and junior safety **Brison Williams**. Hampton is considered the shutdown corner, while Legree has played both corner and safety during his career. Legree has an interception in each of the last two games and has five in his career. Here are the 2013 and career numbers for the Gamecock defense:

**THE FRISCO KID:** True freshman **Elliott Fry** walked on to the Gamecock squad this summer and earned the starting placekicking chores. The Frisco, Texas product is a perfect 3-for-3 in field goal attempts this season, hitting from 39 and 26 yards in the season opener against North Carolina and on a 36-yarder at Georgia. He has not had an attempt in the last two games. He became the first true freshman placekicker to kick in the Gamecocks' season opener since Courtney Leavitt in 1996.

**HULL OF A PUNTER:** Junior **Tyler Hull** is in his second season as the Gamecocks' punter. The 6-2, 206-pounder from Mount Airy, N.C. spent his first season at Guilford College before transferring to South Carolina just prior to the start of the 2012 campaign. Last season, he averaged 39.4 yards per punt. 22 of his 54 punts were fair catches, while 12 went inside the 20. This year he is averaging 37.5 yards per punt with five of his 13 punts inside the 20 and a long of 55 yards.

**THEY'RE BACK:** The Gamecocks welcomed 36 returning letterwinners to begin the 2013 campaign. That group consists of 19 offensive players, 16 defensive players and one special teams player. The Gamecocks lost 24 lettermen, including 10 on offense, 11 on defense and three from special teams.

**FOR STARTERS:** The Gamecocks listed 12 returning starters from the 2012 squad (six on offense, five on defense and one specialist). The returning offensive starters are OG **A.J. Cann**, WR **Bruce Ellington**, OG **Ronald Patrick**, OT **Corey Robinson**, QB **Connor Shaw** and OT **Brandon Shell**. The returning defensive starters include DE **Jadeveon Clowney**, CB **Victor Hampton**, CB **Jimmy Legree**, DT **Kelcy Quarles**, SS **Brison Williams**. The lone returning specialist is P **Tyler Hull**.

**FIRST TIMERS:** Eleven Gamecocks have made their first career starts this season. Eight made their first career start in the season-opening win over North Carolina. The first-time starters included four on offense (TB **Mike Davis**, TE **Drew Owens**, WR **Shaq Roland** and OC **Cody Waldrop**) and four on defense (Spur **Sharrod Golightly**, LB **Kaiwan Lewis**, SS **Kadetrax Marcus** and LB **Marquis Roberts**). OC **Clayton Stadnik** and CB **Ahmad Christian** both made their first career starts at Georgia. **Mason Zandi**, who has spent the majority of his young career at tackle, made a start at tight end against Vanderbilt.

**BROTHER ACT:** The Gamecocks have two sets of brothers on the squad. Redshirt freshmen offensive linemen **Brock and Clayton Stadnik** are twins. On the defensive line, **Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr.** are half-brothers. They share the same father, Gerald Dixon Sr., who played at Carolina in the early 90s.

**THE LEGACY CONTINUES:** The Gamecocks roster features four players whose fathers also donned the Garnet & Black: junior defensive tackle **Kelcy Quarles** and his father, Buddy (1984-87); sophomore defensive linemen **Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr.** and their father, Gerald (1990-91); and redshirt freshman **Jordan Diggs** and his father, Shed (1984-87).

**TWO-SPORT STARS:** Head coach Steve Spurrier is not adverse to having his players participate in other sports at Carolina. Wide receiver **Bruce Ellington** has been the starting point guard for the basketball team for the past three seasons, while tailback **Shon Carson** and cornerback **Ahmad Christian** spent the spring with the Gamecock baseball team. In addition, wide receiver **Damiere Byrd** was a sprinter during the indoor track & field season.

**AN SEC SIX-PACK:** With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2012, the Gamecocks reached six SEC victories for the second year in a row. They had never had six SEC wins in a season prior to 2011. They finished the 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2010 seasons with 5-3 SEC marks. Carolina finished 2012 with at least a .500 SEC mark for the 10th time in 21 seasons and have put together three-straight .500-or-better SEC records for the first time in school history.

**GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC:** The Gamecocks wrapped up their 21st season of league play in the SEC in 2012. They have played 170 SEC regular-season contests since joining the league. Here's a breakdown of the Gamecocks in three-year segments in conference regular season action:

**IN THE CLASSROOM:** The Gamecocks placed 29 players on the 2012 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll while posting a team GPA of 2.918, highest in school history. Among those who made the SEC Honor Roll include returnees **Landon Ard, K.J. Brent, Damiere Byrd, A.J. Cann, Shon Carson, Gerald Dixon Jr., Phillip Dukes, Bruce Ellington, Deon Green, Mason Harris, Tyler Hull, Kadetrix Marcus, Drew Owens, Ronald Patrick, Kelvin Rainey, Corey Robinson, Brandon Shell, Brock Stadnik, Clayton Stadnik** and **Dylan Thompson**.

**WORKING OVERTIME:** The Gamecocks have played just two overtime games in their history, both at Tennessee. They dropped a 23-20 decision in Knoxville on Sept. 27, 2003, then fell by a 27-24 score on Oct. 27, 2007, at Neyland Stadium.

**THEY PAY TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY:** The Gamecocks ranked 18th in the nation in home attendance in 2012, averaging 80,001 at Williams-Brice Stadium. That included a school-record 85,199 who were on hand to watch the Gamecocks thump Georgia, 35-7. The Gamecocks have sold out each of their first two home games this season, with a capacity crowd of 81,572 against North Carolina and a full house of 81,371 against Vanderbilt. The Kentucky, Florida and Clemson games are also sold out, while a limited number of tickets remain for the other two home games (Mississippi State and Coastal Carolina).

**KEEPING THE FANS HAPPY:** The Gamecocks have taken care of business against their top rivals in recent seasons. Since 2010, they are an impressive 11-2 against SEC Eastern Division rivals Georgia (3-1), Florida (2-1) and Tennessee (3-0) and against in-state rival Clemson (3-0). In fact, Carolina has won the Palmetto State Championship four years in a row, the longest winning streak over the Tigers since 1951-54.

**WHO'S PAYING FOR THIS?:** Two walk-ons were rewarded with scholarships for the 2013-14 school year this fall. Junior fullback **Connor McLaurin** and junior cornerback **Sidney Rhodes** will have their school tabs paid for this year.

**RECRUITING SUCCESS:** The Gamecocks had another successful February signing day. Carolina has put together nine-straight classes that rank among the nation's top 25, according to *Rivals*. Here are the recent recruiting class rankings according to *Rivals* and *Scout*:

**LEXINGTON, KY**— Sixth-ranked South Carolina erased a 10-point halftime deficit, scoring 31 second half points, on the way to a 38-17 victory over Kentucky on Saturday night at Commonwealth Stadium. The Gamecocks are 5-0 on the year and 3-0 in the SEC while the loss drops Kentucky to 1-4 overall and 0-2 in the league. It was the Gamecocks' ninth-straight win, tying the school record set in 1984.

Junior running back Marcus Lattimore carried 23 times for 120 rushing yards and tallied two touchdowns with junior quarterback Connor Shaw going 15-for-18 in the air for 148 yards and two touchdowns as well as 19 carries for 76 yards on the ground.

The Gamecocks appeared to be going in for the first score of the game midway through the first quarter on their second drive of the game. With 3rd and goal from the Kentucky 1, the Kentucky defense stood tall and stopped South Carolina on a pair of quarterback sneaks to take over on downs near the goal line.

The Wildcats rode the momentum of their defense putting together a 16-play 94-yard drive before settling for a 22-yard field goal by Craig McIntosh that gave Kentucky a 3-0 lead. Twice, the Wildcats converted a pair of 3rd-and-long conversions on 12-yard rush by Jalen Whitlow and a 24-yard rush from Sanders. A key 20-yard pass completion as well as a 15-yard face mask penalty gave Kentucky the ball deep in Carolina territory. However, the Gamecock defense responded on its own with a goal line stand, forcing McIntosh to kick a first field goal.

South Carolina broke on top in the second quarter going 64 yards to paydirt. Shaw rushed for 11 yards and completed a pair of passes to Marcus Lattimore as well as a 37-yard completion to Rory Anderson that put the Gamecocks into scoring position. Deep into Kentucky territory, Shaw found Ace Sanders for a three-yard touchdown reception giving the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead.

Kentucky answered on its next possession though with a touchdown of its own to regain the lead. Whitlow had a steady dose of rushes and passes before capping the drive with an eight-yard touchdown run. The Wildcats were also aided on the drive by a 15-yard face mask penalty by the Gamecocks that moved Kentucky deep into South Carolina territory.

With a three-point lead, Kentucky held the Gamecock offense to a three and out and blocked Tyler Hull's punt giving the Wildcats the ball on the South Carolina 34-yard line. As Kentucky threatened, the Gamecocks suffered a bad break as a tipped pass by Gamecock defensive back Jimmy Legree landed in the hands of UK wide receiver Daryl Collins as Kentucky made its way into the red zone. Raymond Sanders capped the drive with a 10-yard touchdown run that increased Kentucky's lead to 17-7.

Trailing 17-7 at halftime, the Gamecocks scored on their opening possession of the second half to cut the deficit to three. A 14-yard rush to convert a third down followed by an 11-yard rush by Shaw set up a 30-yard touchdown pass to Damiere Byrd.

After the defense forced a three-and-out, the Gamecock offense drove 57 yards on the next drive to regain the lead. Carolina mixed the run and the pass on an eight-play drive that was capped by a 17-yard touchdown run by Kenny Miles, putting Carolina ahead for good at 21-17.

With a four-point advantage heading into the fourth quarter, South Carolina put the game away with two more touchdowns and a field goal. The Gamecocks' longest drive of the season in time of possession, 7:12, was capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Lattimore. It was a 14-play, 81-yard drive that featured 63 rushing yards by Lattimore.

The Gamecocks held a 28-17 lead with the defense continuing its steady play. DeVonte Holloman intercepted the Kentucky quarterback on the next possession with freshman defensive tackle Gerald Dixon Jr. coming up with another interception on the Wildcats' next possession. Dixon Jr.'s interception set up Lattimore's second touchdown of the game, this one from four yards out. Carolina would add a 31-yard field goal by Adam Yates to complete the scoring. After allowing 173 total yards in the first half, the defense delivered in the second half, shutting out the Wildcats on just 70 yards in the final 30 minutes. Carolina's offense was stellar in the second half scoring 31 points and gaining 240 yards, including 184 yards on the ground.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**—Con-  
 nor Shaw threw for a career-high  
 311 yards and four touchdowns  
 to lead No. 18/14 South Carolina  
 to a convincing 54-3 victory over  
 Kentucky.

Shaw completed 26-of-39  
 passes and added 42 yards rush-  
 ing to help the Gamecocks (5-1,  
 3-1 SEC) amass 639 yards of total  
 offense.

South Carolina racked up 288  
 yards on the ground led by sopho-  
 more running back Marcus Lattim-  
 ore, who rushed for 102 yards  
 on 22 carries. Lattimore has now  
 rushed for 100 yards eight times in  
 his career. Bruce Ellington added  
 a 61-yard touchdown run. Junior Alshon Jeffery hauled in six passes for 95 yards  
 and two scores, while sophomore Ace Sanders added 53 yards receiving and junior  
 Justice Cunningham had 46 yards and a touchdown.

South Carolina's defense was also dominant, holding the Wildcats (2-4, 0-3) to  
 just 96 yards of offense (17 passing, 79 rushing) and forcing six turnovers. It marked  
 the second time this season the Gamecocks have held a SEC opponent below 100  
 yards, as they accomplished the feat against Vanderbilt (77 yards) on Sept. 24. The  
 Gamecocks have forced 10 turnovers in their last two outings.

Junior D.J. Swearingin, freshman Victor Hampton, junior Stephon Gilmore and  
 senior C.C. Whitlock each had an interception to lead the Gamecocks, who have 12  
 interceptions this year.

The defense set the tone early after Kentucky recovered a South Carolina fumble on  
 the opening kickoff at the Gamecock 26-yard line, holding the Wildcats to a 28-yard  
 field goal by Craig McIntosh.

Shaw then guided the offense down the field to give the Gamecocks a lead they did  
 not relinquish. Shaw completed a 46-yard pass to Rory Anderson to set South Caro-  
 lina up at the Kentucky 20. On the next play, he found Jeffery for a 20-yard touchdown  
 strike to give the Gamecocks a 7-3 advantage with 9:16 left in the first quarter.

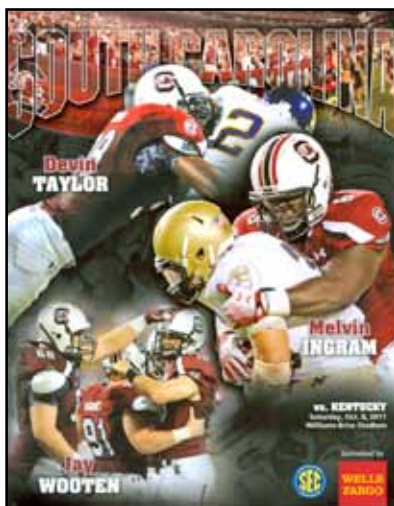
South Carolina pushed its lead to 13-3 early in the second quarter, as Shaw found  
 Cunningham for an 11-yard touchdown pass, capping a seven-play, 55-yard drive.

Shaw and Jeffery connected once again for a 24-yard touchdown pass midway  
 through the second quarter to give the Gamecocks a 20-3 lead heading into the locker  
 room. The touchdown reception moved Jeffery into a tie for second place on the  
 Gamecocks' career receiving touchdowns list with 19, tying Robert Brooks, Jermale  
 Kelly and Kenny McKinley.

Shaw threw for his fourth touchdown of the afternoon on South Carolina's first  
 drive of the third quarter, finding Nick Jones wide-open for a 25-yard scoring strike to  
 give the Gamecocks a 27-3 lead at the 8:46 mark.

After Jay Wooten made field goal attempts of 48 and 42 yards to push the Game-  
 cocks' lead to 33-3, Ellington put an exclamation point on the win with a 61-yard  
 touchdown run with 10:34 left in the fourth quarter.

The Gamecocks added two more scores late in the contest, as junior D.L. Moore  
 caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from sophomore Andrew Clifford and freshman  
 Dylan Thompson scored on an 8-yard run.

Steve Spurrier, who has coached a national championship team, won seven Southeastern Conference titles, garnered nine conference Coach of the Year awards, and won 73 percent of the college games in which he has coached, is in his ninth season as head coach at the University of South Carolina. Spurrier was introduced as Carolina's 32nd head coach on Nov. 23, 2004.

Coach Spurrier has compiled a 211-78-2 (.729) won-loss record in 24 seasons as a major college head coach, including a 69-38 mark (.645) at Carolina. He became the 71st collegiate coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I to record 200 career victories when he defeated UAB on Sept. 15, 2012 and logged his 250th all-time coaching win against Georgia on October 6, 2012.

Coach Spurrier surpassed Rex Enright's school record for wins when he logged number 65 at Clemson in the 2012 season finale. In doing so, he joined the great Bear Bryant as the only coaches to boast the most coaching victories at two different SEC schools.

He led the Duke Blue Devils to the 1989 Atlantic Coast Conference championship before returning to his alma mater, the University of Florida, as head coach in 1990. During his 12 seasons with the Gators, Spurrier's teams won seven Southeastern Conference championships, one national title and finished ranked in the nation's top 10 nine times. His record at Florida was an amazing 122-27-1 (.817). Spurrier, who won the 1966 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback for the Gators, was also head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins (2002-03). He returned to the college ranks in 2005 after a one-year absence from the sidelines.

In his first season at South Carolina, Coach Spurrier led the Gamecocks to a 7-5 record and a second-place finish in the SEC Eastern Division. In doing so, he posted a five-game winning streak, the 15th-consecutive year in which he has had a five-game winning streak, something no other coach in college history has accomplished. He was honored as the SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press after leading the Gamecocks to a school-record five straight SEC wins, their first win ever at Tennessee and their first win over Florida since the 1930s.

He came back with an 8-5 record in 2006, just the ninth time in school history that the Gamecocks posted eight or more wins in a season. The season was capped with a Liberty Bowl win over C-USA champion Houston.

In his third season with the Garnet & Black, Spurrier's squad raced out to a 6-1 record and moved as high as No. 6 in the BCS rankings, before finishing the campaign with a 6-6 record. With 21 wins, he set the Carolina record for coaching victories after three seasons at the helm.

With a 7-6 record in 2008, Carolina returned to a New Year's Day bowl game for the first time since the 2001 season. The Gamecocks followed that up with another 7-6 record in 2009, their sixth-consecutive non-losing season, the longest stretch in school history since 1928-34. The 2009 season included a win over No. 4 Ole Miss, only the second time in school history

that Carolina had defeated a top-five team.

His 2010 Gamecock squad posted several milestones en route to a 9-5 season, the biggest of which was the school's first SEC Eastern Division title and first appearance in the SEC Championship. The Gamecocks also defeated the nation's No. 1 team, Alabama, for the first time in school history, and finished the season ranked 22nd in both major national polls. He was named SEC Coach of the Year for the seventh time, his ninth overall Coach of the Year honor.

The Gamecocks continued to make history in 2011, winning a school record 11 games and finishing in the top-10 in the final A.P. poll for the first time. The squad also won a school-record six SEC games and defeated each of their Eastern Division rivals in the same season for the first time. Carolina capped the regular season with a win over Clemson, its third-straight over its Palmetto State rival, the first time that has been accomplished since 1968-70, then defeated Nebraska in the Capital One Bowl by a convincing 30-13 margin.

The 2012 season was another success, as the Gamecocks rolled up a school-record 11 wins for the second-straight season and logged double-digits in wins for just the third time in school history, capped off by a 33-28 win over Michigan in the Outback Bowl. They defeated four teams that finished among the nation's top 25 in Georgia, Clemson, Vanderbilt and Michigan. The Gamecocks defeated in-state rival Clemson for a fourth-straight year, the first time that had been accomplished since the 1950s.

## #6/7 South Carolina 27, North Carolina 10

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— Quick offensive strikes from Connor Shaw and Mike Davis helped No. 6/7 South Carolina (1-0) dispatch of North Carolina (0-1) 27-10 in the college football season opener at Williams-Brice Stadium.

On the third play from scrimmage, the senior quarterback Shaw found sophomore wide receiver Shaq Roland over the middle for a 65-yard touchdown strike, putting the Gamecocks in the lead 7-0. The 82-yard drive marked the quickest score for South Carolina in a season in the SEC era (since 1992). Shaw ended the contest going 11-for-20 for 149 yards and the one TD pass while adding 43 yards on the ground.

Davis, the sophomore running back who won the starting job in fall camp, capped South Carolina's scoring with his third-quarter, 75-yard run over the right side to make it 27-10. Davis ended the day with a career-high 115 yards on 12 carries.

South Carolina held a 17-0 lead before the first quarter ended, with freshman Elliott Fry's first collegiate field goal, a 39-yarder, making it 10-0. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson, on his first play of the game, made it 17-0 with a 29-yard touchdown throw to sophomore wide receiver Kane Whitehurst.

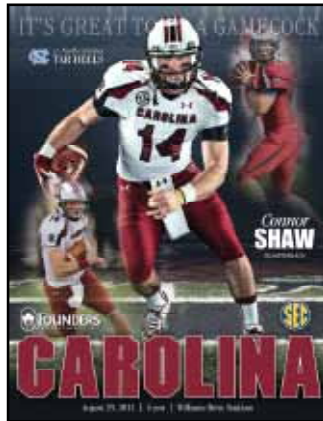
In the second quarter, North Carolina got on the board on Bryn Renner's four-yard pass to Quinshad Davis, but Fry's second field goal, this one from 26 yards, handed South Carolina a 20-7 lead that stood at the half. The Gamecocks doubled the Tar Heels in first downs in the first half, 12-6, and tallied more yards, 260-121. Seventy of UNC's yards came on its scoring drive.

The Tar Heels opened the second half with a 17-play, 67-yard drive capped by a Thomas Moore 20-yard field goal before Davis' 75-yard dash.

The game was halted at 8:46 p.m. due to lightning in the area, delaying the game for 1:44. After the break, North Carolina threatened to score with two minutes to go, but a dive toward the end zone by Renner fell a yard short on fourth-and-goal, turning the ball back over downs to the Gamecocks with 58 seconds remaining.

Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds ran for 64 yards on 12 carries, while junior Nick Jones and Roland both matched career bests in receptions with four and two, respectively. Four of the Gamecocks' returning defenders (Sharrod Golightly, T.J. Gurley, Chaz Sutton & Ahmad Christian) matched or bettered their previous career high in tackles, and sophomore Gerald Dixon Jr. posted his first career tackle and quarterback hurry.

Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier improved to 23-1 as a collegiate head coach in the lid-lifter, including 9-0 at South Carolina. He also owns a 5-0 record over the Tar Heels, with two of those wins coming in the Garnet and Black. South Carolina's home winning streak stands at 12 games now, one shy of tying the second-best stretch in Williams-Brice Stadium (1986-88).

**ATHENS, Ga.** — A back and forth affair went to the No. 11/12 Georgia Bulldogs as the No. 6/6 South Carolina Gamecocks fell 41-30 in front of sellout crowd of 92,746 fans at Sanford Stadium. It was a day for the offense as the Gamecocks and Bulldogs combined for 990 total yards. South Carolina rushed for 226 with 228 in the air while Georgia rushed for 227 and passed for 309 in the contest.

South Carolina took the opening drive 57 yards to set up for a 36-yard field goal by Eliot Fry to take an early 3-0 lead. The Gamecocks mixed the pass with the run including a pair of third-down conversions that featured a 14-yard pass completion by Connor Shaw to Nick Jones and a 21-yard rush by Mike Davis.

Georgia answered the Gamecocks on its opening drive that was capped by a three-yard touchdown pass by Aaron Murray to tight end Arthur Lynch. The Bulldogs drove deep into South Carolina territory on a 32-yard pass completion from Murray to Michael Bennett and a 19-yard rush by Gurley. With 2nd & goal on the 3, Murray play faked and found Lynch in the end zone to give the Bulldogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldogs showed some trickery following the touchdown as they went with an onside kick that was recovered by cornerback Blake Sailors to give Georgia another possession on their own 48-yard line. The Bulldogs made its way into Carolina territory for a second consecutive possession and went into the red zone after a 4th & 13 completion from Murray to Scott-Wesley. Inside the Gamecocks' 10-yard line, Carolina held tough and UGA settled for a Patrick Beless 22-yard field goal to extend the advantage to 10-3.

The Bulldogs went seven plays and 69 yards to increase the lead to 17-3 on a six-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Keith Marshall. After Jadeveon Clowney netted his first sack of the season, the Bulldogs made up for the 10-yard loss with a 16-yard rush by Marshall followed by a 15-yard face mask penalty on the Gamecock defense.

South Carolina responded with a 12-play, 84-yard drive to answer the Bulldogs and cut the deficit to seven points. Davis was key for the Gamecocks as he had a 23-yard rush to begin the drive and a three-yard carry on 4th & 2 at the UGA 11 to keep the drive going. The Gamecocks would punch it in the end zone on a seven-yard carry by Brandon Wilds.

The Gamecock defense forced a three-and-out for the Bulldogs on the next possession. South Carolina then caught a break as punter Collin Barber mishandled the snap allowing the Gamecocks to recover on the UGA 18-yard line. South Carolina rode the momentum of the punt mishap and responded quickly to tie it up at 17 as Shaw found Jones in the corner of the end zone on the first play for an 18-yard touchdown.

The pendulum swung to Georgia as the Bulldogs went 11 plays in 70 yards in the ensuing drive to reclaim a 24-17 lead. Gurley again was a focal point for Georgia with seven carries for 46 yards including a 2-yard touchdown run with 1:42 remaining in the half.

South Carolina answered one more time to tie the game at 24 going into halftime. With three timeouts and 1:38 remaining on the Carolina 29-yard line, Shaw manufactured an 11-play, 70-yard drive capped by a 30-yard touchdown pass to Nick Jones.

The Bulldogs capitalized on Carolina's first turnover of the season to go ahead 27-24 on Beless' second field goal of the game, this one from 37 yards. The Gamecocks were driving and appeared to convert a fourth down but quarterback Connor Shaw fumbled right before his knee hit the ground, allowing the Bulldogs to take over on the Georgia 25-yard line.

Georgia extended the lead to 34-24 near the end of the quarter on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Gurley. The Bulldogs went 13 plays for 82 yards with Murray finding Gurley on third down, just eluding the sack attempt by Carolina defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles.

South Carolina dug deep and responded again as Davis tallied a 75-yard run from scrimmage to end the third quarter and move the Gamecocks into scoring position at the Georgia five-yard line. Three plays later, Davis scored on a three-yard touchdown. The extra point attempt sailed left as Georgia stayed ahead 34-30 with 13:55 remaining in the game.

With Georgia 3rd & 13 on their own 15-yard line, Murray eluded another Gamecock sack attempt and found Scott-Wesley behind the Gamecock defensive backfield for a completion. Scott-Wesley took it down the sideline and into the end zone to give Georgia a 41-30 lead with 13 minutes to go in the fourth quarter.

The Bulldogs remained in possession the final 8:28 of the game with 13 plays to secure the victory including a 4th & 2 conversion with 2:42 in the game.

## #13/14 South Carolina 35, Vanderbilt 25

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**— Behind senior quarterback Connor Shaw's 368 yards of total offense, South Carolina (2-1, 1-1 SEC) held on to defeat Vanderbilt 35-25 on Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium.

Shaw threw for 284 yards and three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing while also leading the Gamecocks in rushing with 84 yards on 19 carries. Junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington made a career-best eight catches for 111 yards and a score, while sophomore running back Mike Davis added 144 all-purpose yards (77 rushing, 67 receiving) in the victory. Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds caught his first career TD pass, while junior Nick Jones also had a TD catch.

South Carolina scored on its first four possessions of the game. The first, set up by Ellington's 12-yard punt return to the Vandy 42, needed just six plays, with all the yards (27 passing, 15 rushing) coming from Shaw. Shaw hit Jones with a bullet toward the back of the end zone for a 12-yard touchdown pass. The second Gamecock drive went much longer, as it took 11 plays to cover 93 yards. Davis capped the drive with a four-yard run. The biggest play came on Davis' 38-yard catch-and-run from Shaw that put South Carolina on the Vandy 24.

Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson piloted the third drive, an eight-play, 76-yard one that ended with his three-yard draw for the score. He went 5-for-5 for 67 yards, with all five passes going for first downs. The second quarter saw the Gamecocks keep rolling, scoring an eight-yard, 92-yard drive. Shaw hit Ellington in traffic from 26 yards out for the score, the third catch of the drive for the junior. He also had a three-yard grab and a 39-yard catch as well in the sequence.

Vanderbilt (1-2, 0-2 SEC) scored late in the first half on Jerron Seymour's one-yard run. Steven Clarke's 69-yard interception of Thompson's pass set up the one-play, one-yard score. It was the first interception given up by the Gamecocks in 72 pass attempts in 2013. The Commodores added a 54-yard field goal from Carey Spear as the half ended. South Carolina outgained Vanderbilt 381-95 in the first half and ran 52 plays to Vandy's 24.

The Gamecocks put up another touchdown on their first possession of the second half when Wilds caught a 33-yard TD pass from Shaw, finishing the 10-play, 75-yard drive in 4:38. On the ensuing Vandy possession, the Commodores drove deep into Gamecock territory before junior defensive end Jadeveon Clowney sacked VU's Austyn Carta-Samuels and forced a fumble, which senior defensive tackle Kelsey Quarles recovered, ending that Vandy threat.

But the Commodores kept coming, scoring early in the fourth quarter on Carta-Samuels' one-yard run, which ended a 10-play, 45-yard drive. The ensuing kickoff was fumbled by the Gamecocks, setting up Wesley Tate's 19-yard reception from Carta-Samuels for the score. The two-point pass to tight end Steven Schue was good, making it 35-25 in favor of South Carolina. After a stalled Vanderbilt drive, the punt hit a Gamecock defender, and VU's Darrius Sims recovered, giving the Commodores another life. But senior cornerback Jimmy Legree picked off the Carta-Samuel pass on the goal line, the first interception by a Gamecock in 2013.

The Gamecocks, taking over at the one-yard line, ran the clock down to a minute before turning the ball over on downs at the Vanderbilt 36. The Commodores' final possession was unfruitful, giving the Gamecocks the win.

**ORLANDO, Fla.** — Behind a huge second half from sophomore running back Mike Davis, South Carolina (3-1) picked up a hard-fought 28-25 road win at UCF (3-1) at Bright House Networks Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

In front of a broadcast TV audience on ABC, Davis ran for a career-best 167 yards on 26 carries, scoring three times to lead South Carolina's comeback effort after being down 10-0 at half. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson came in after an injury to senior Connor Shaw and threw for 261 yards while also running for a score in the victory.

Davis put the Gamecocks on the board just four plays into the second half with his 53-yard dash to the end zone. Davis had three of the four carries in the quick scoring drive. After the Gamecock defense forced a three-and-out, South Carolina drove again until another fumble, this by sophomore running back Brandon Wilds, ended the chance. But South Carolina's defense stepped up again and stopped the Knights from getting a first down.

The Gamecocks took the lead on the next drive when Thompson ran for two-yard score after rolling out right and seeing the opening. Freshman Elliott Fry's PAT capped an 11-play, 97-yard drive, the longest drive of the year by yards for South Carolina. Senior cornerback Jimmy Legree intercepted a Blake Bortles pass and returned it 21 yard, setting up the next Gamecock score, as Davis carried a defender for the last bit of his 13-yard score that after the Fry kick became 21-10 for the visitors.

Davis put his third ball in the end zone with another 13-yard score, giving South Carolina a 28-10 lead early in the fourth quarter. UCF kept fighting, getting big throws from its senior quarterback Bortles in scoring the final 15 points of the contest. Bortles twice found Rannell Hall for scores, first a 73-yard catch-and-run before a seven-yard strike with 1:54 remaining in the game. The ensuing onside attempt by the Knights was gathered by Gamecock junior wide receiver Bruce Ellington, who returned it 31 yards. The Gamecocks took a knee three times to run out the clock to take the win.

The Knights held a 10-0 lead at halftime, scoring on the first drive of the game in 4:55 after Storm Johnson's one-yard run and a second-quarter Shawn Moffitt 27-yard field goal. UCF had fortunes on their side, recovering both of their own fumbles while getting the lone Gamecock fumble of the first half, which came on the play that knocked South Carolina's starting quarterback Shaw from the contest with a strained right shoulder.

The Gamecocks had a chance toward the end of the second quarter after junior cornerback Victor Hampton intercepted the Bortles pass with 1:17 left. Thompson drove the Gamecocks to the UCF 28 before a penalty ended the momentum and took the Gamecocks out of field goal range. The final play of the half saw Thompson get hit as he threw, altering the flight of the ball to allow Sean Maag to intercept it at the UCF 20. The Knights only had 32 more yards of offense (196-164) than the Gamecocks in the first 30 minutes of play but held the 10-0 lead.

South Carolina picked off three passes in the contest, one each for Hampton, Legree and redshirt freshman T.J. Holloman, the most by a Gamecock team since last season's East Carolina contest. Sophomore Gerald Dixon also picked up a fumble recovery. Both teams forced three fumbles, but the Knights kept two of theirs.

Offensively, Ellington's 88 receiving yards put him over 1,000 for his career, while junior Damiere Byrd had a career-best five receptions.
