SCGOP Primary - March 2025

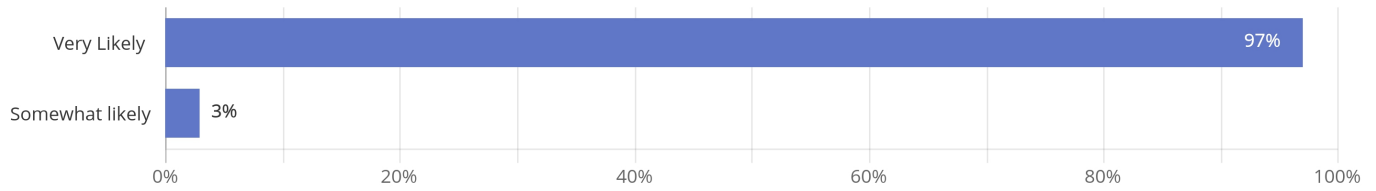
Public Report

The SCGOP Primary Survey was conducted by IVR and Online (Online-to-Mobile) Interviews from March 19 - March 21 among a random sample of 500 likely SCGOP primary voters. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.4 percentage points. Results are weighted. Some percentages in crosstab reports for this poll may not add to 100% due to rounding.

■ Very Likely

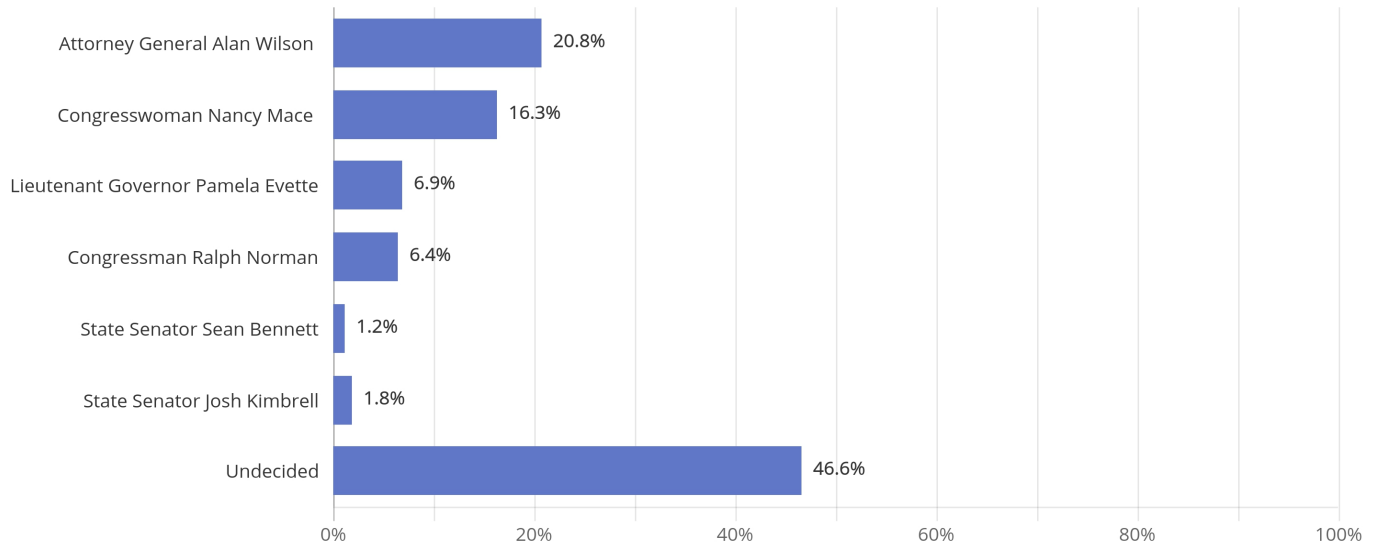

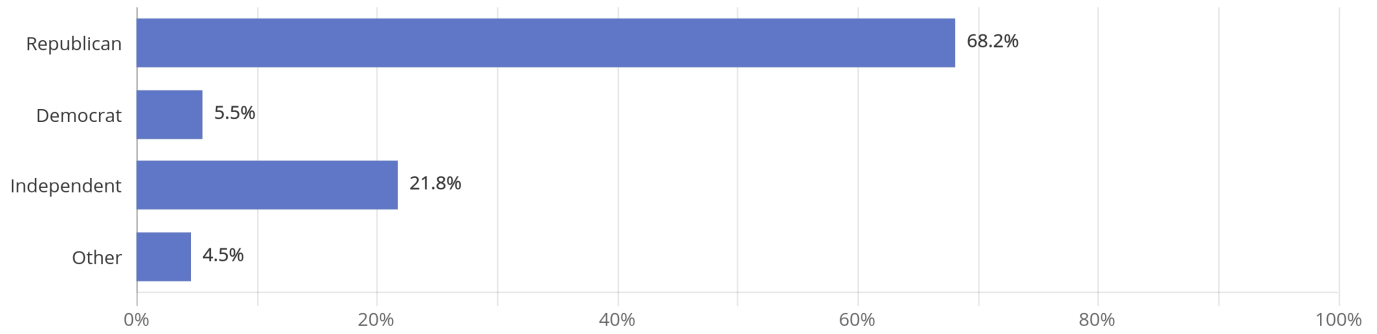

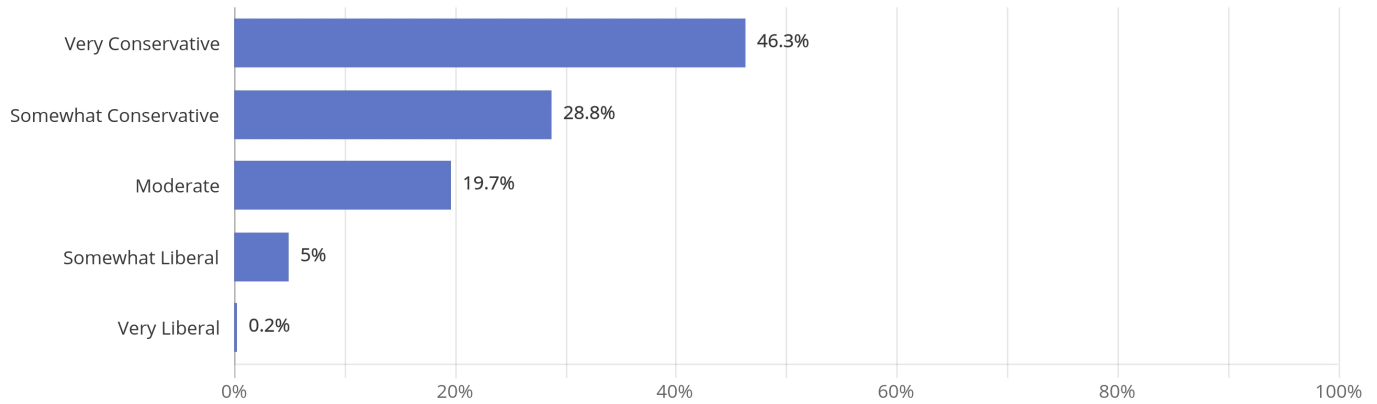

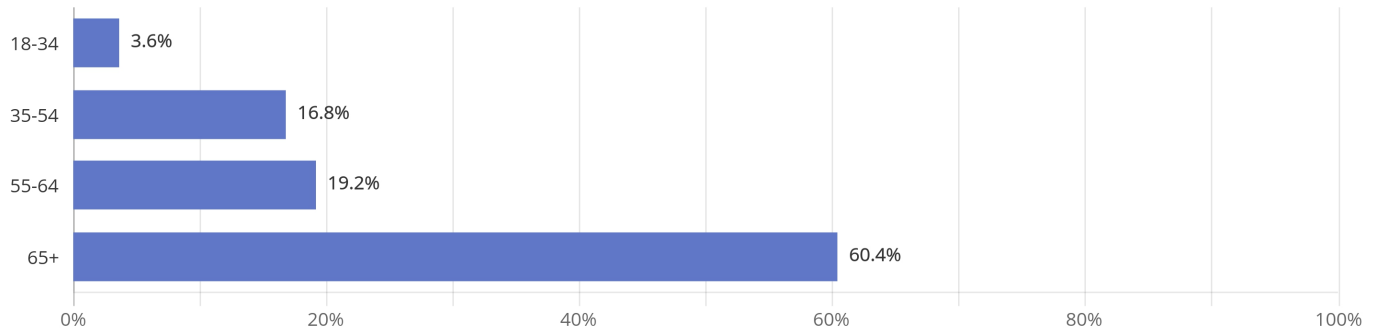

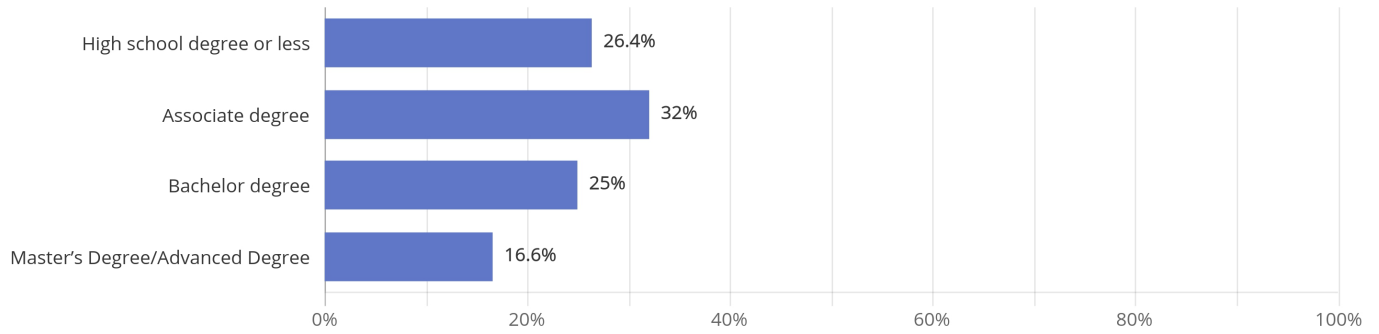

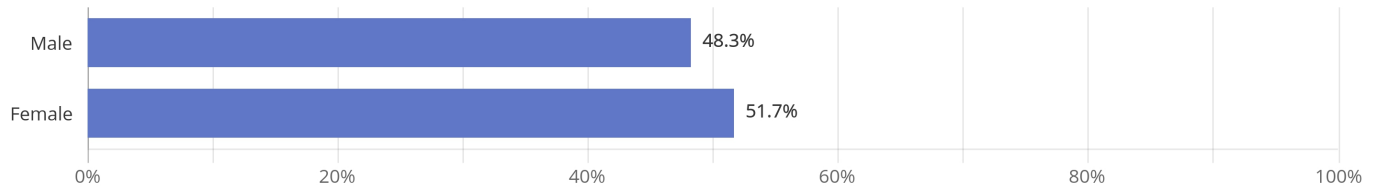

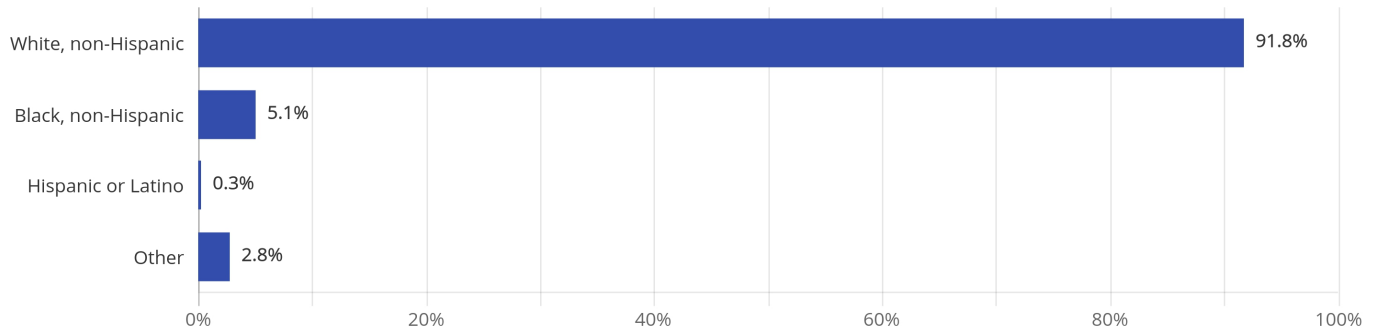

What is your ethnicity?

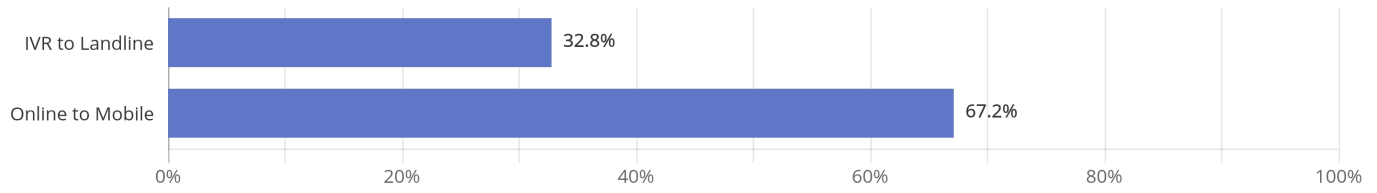
