



6. Plaintiff has evidence that a doctor in Anderson, South Carolina prescribed additional morphine, without seeing the patient, shortly before her death.
7. The prescription was believed to be picked up by Dale Colegrove.
8. South Carolina law authorizes the appointment of a special administrator in a formal proceeding by order of the court on the petition of any interested person. S.C. Code Ann. § 62-3-614.
9. The Court may appoint Plaintiff as a special administrator upon finding, after notice and hearing, that it is necessary for the administration of the estate. *ID.*
10. Due to Dale Colegrove having a conflict of interest, it is necessary to appoint a special administrator.
11. Plaintiff is willing and able to serve as a special administrator for the limited purpose of pursuing these claims.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this Court enter an Order:

1. Appointing Plaintiff as Special Administrator of the Estate of Pearl Colegrove for the limited purpose of pursuing the claims in this case and the medical malpractice claim that flows from it.
2. Granting Plaintiff the authority to prosecute the pending lawsuit.
3. Granting such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
